INSTRUCTIONS TO SUBMIT

- Please select from one of the two given topics below:
 - (1) The Japanese American WWII veteran experience is still relevant to our society today. Explore one of the ways this is true.
 - (2) The Japanese American WWII veteran story is now over 70 years old. Discuss your ideas on preserving the Japanese American WWII veteran story for future generations.
- Please select to either: A) write an essay or B) video a performance or C) create your choice of visual art and submit a photo or video
- Limits
 - Essays 250-500 words
 - Performance 3 to 5 minute video of an original performance. This includes spoken word, performed poetry, original song, or an original short play.
 - Visual art Produce your choice of visual art including drawing, painting, mixed media, print, photograph, collage, or 3-5
 minutes of edited video. Submit this as a photo or video with a short explanation (up to 250 words) of the work. Please do not
 use copyrighted material in your visual art, unless it is from Go For Broke National Education Center's video or photo collection.
- Please identify which category you are entering, phone number, your school/university, title of your entry, and grade/level (what grade you are/were in for the 2017-2018 school year).
- Please email essays to studentcontest@goforbroke.org by Sunday, July 1, 2018. Essays must be sent as Word docs.
- Please post videos of performances to YouTube, and email a link to studentcontest@goforbroke.org by Sunday, July 1, 2018.
- Please submit a photo or video of your visual art. Include a short explanation of up to 250 words as a Word doc. Post videos to YouTube, and email a link to studentcontest@goforbroke.org. Send photos of your visual art as a jpeg attachment to studentcontest@goforbroke.org. All entries must be received by Sunday, July 1, 2018.
- Visual arts winners will be required to share an original video file or a high resolution photo file with Go For Broke National Education Center.
- · A panel will be judging the essays, videos, and photos.
- Winners will be notified by Saturday, August 11, 2018.
- All contestants will be added to Go For Broke National Education Center's etorch email list to receive updates on the organization.

ELIGIBILITY

- This contest is open to high school (9th through 12th grades) and college (undergraduate and graduate) students.
- If you were a winner the previous year, you are ineligible for entry.
